Materials Needed

- Old fence

Construction is simple.

Instructions

- Bring old fence sections home
- break them up into single pieces
- remove rusty nails
- drop two on the floor horizontally
- drop three on top of those vertically
- screw them together.

I know, sounds impossible, right? But if I can do it, I know you can.



I only did 3 per 4' section, so cars passing by, and little ToT's have a nice view of everything, while keeping the little buggers away from things that will kill them, and making it a wee bit harder for vandals to steal anything from the front yard. My main complaint about most fencing I've seen, is that they are all built WAY too close together, so you need to get right up to the fence to see anything. Sure it looks good, but it's hard to see anything from the perspective of someone who is 3' – 4' tall, who cannot see over the fence like all of us wicked cool (yes, we are from RI) adults can. And I personally think that is dumb. Just my opinion.
